Greek  $\pi$ ioτις pis'-tis; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation.

Greek ἀνυπόκριτος an-oo-pok'-ree-tos; undissembled, i.e. sincere:—without dissimulation (hypocrisy), unfeigned. (Not Faking)

πίστις pis'-tis; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (The truthfulness of God), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation.

The conviction that God exists and is the creator and ruler of all things, the provider and bestower of eternal salvation through Christ. And, a welcome conviction, or belief, that Christ Jesus is the Messiah, and that, by his death and resurrection, we obtain eternal salvation in the kingdom of God.

Goal = Point of aim.

Instruction = Charge, or, command.

Love = All encompassing Love.

Pure = Holy/set apart/without blemish.

Heart = Center of all physical and spiritual life.

Good Conscience = Spirit and mind are as one. (In step).

Sincere Faith = Unfeigned (Real/True) Conviction of the Gospel.
